Receptions Enrolments 2022

Our Partnership of schools are setting up consistent reception enrolment processes across our sites. To ensure your child is enrolled at their local school for next year, we ask that enrolment forms (or expressions of interest if we are not your local school) are lodged with our office before the end of this term.

Mobile Phone Policy

It is a Department for Education expectation that all schools develop a mobile phone policy, have it endorsed by Governing Council and placed on their website, ready to be implemented at the beginning of Term 3. We have gone through this process.

The basis of our mobile phone policy is:

- If a child brings a mobile device to school (this includes smart watches), they are not to be used on school grounds.
- The device is to be stored in a secure spot in the classroom, identified by the class teacher.
- Should a student not follow these processes the Principal will keep hold of the device until it is collected by a parent/caregiver.


"I really enjoy working the major inquiry. I am learning about black holes and how they are formed. I am applying my learning by drawing a labelled scientific diagram."

National Consistent Collection Of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

Over the next month our school will be involved in the National Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability. Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the NCCD guidelines (2019).

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- year of schooling
- category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional
- level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

- formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools
- consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured.
